

After School Art Club: Drawing, Collage, Painting and Sculpture. (Part 1)

I've been working with a group of Year 3 and 4 pupils at [Bourn Primary Academy](#) during an after school art club. The bears seemed the ideal subject matter (and we even had snow outside!). Even better, the bears would provide us with an opportunity to make individual sculptures, which could then be brought together as a communal artwork.

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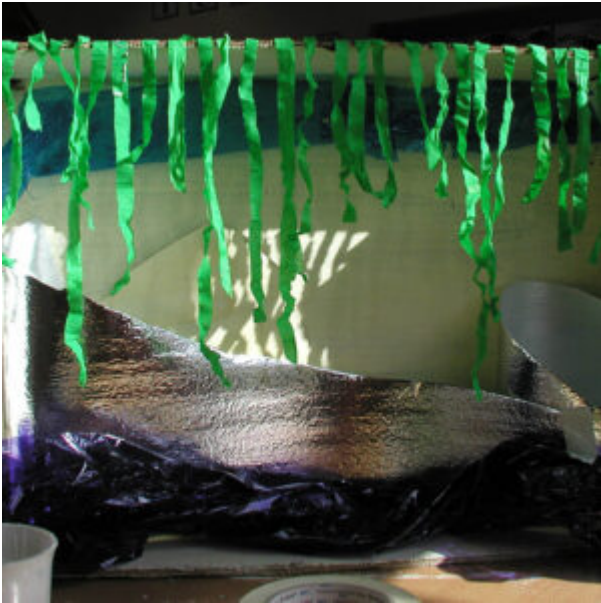
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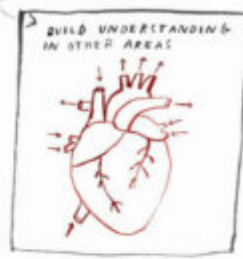
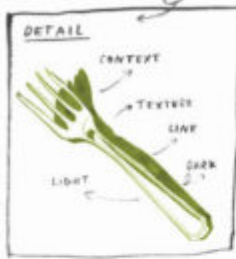
