Help children settle into a flow-like state as they explore the properties of watercolour or ink to create these

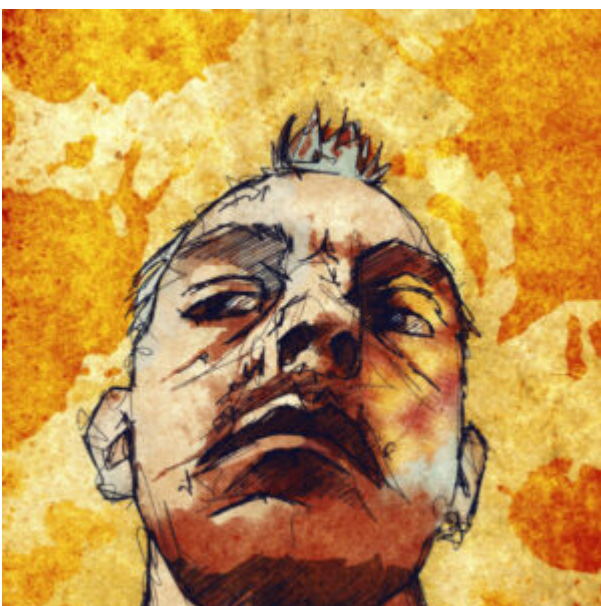
abstract globe-like images

exploring watercolour



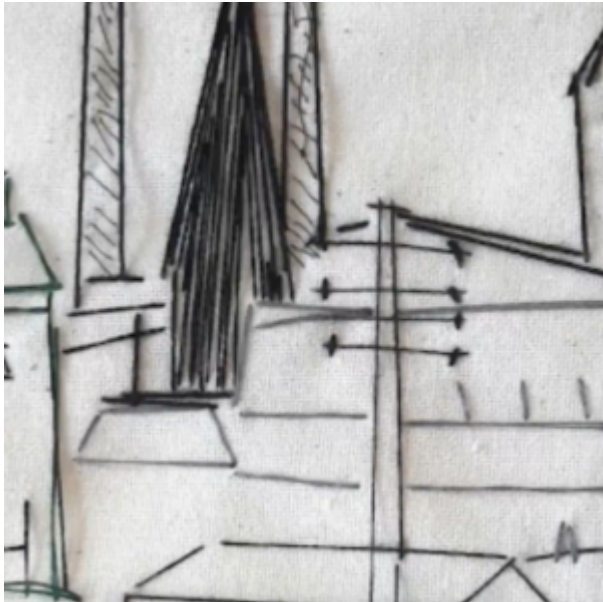
Explore Emma's short series of resources to inspire children to use watery colour to create evocative images

Lizzie Knott inspires us to make images about things that matter to us and turn them into gifs

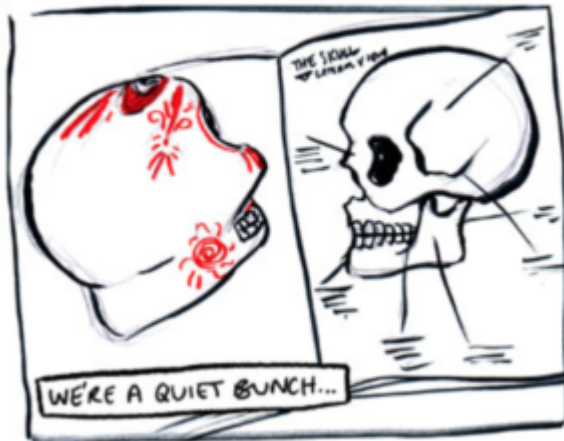
