We started out with some sketchbook work - not so much to design on paper prior to making - but to get our creative juices flowing...

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
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to explore constructing in mixed media and using inventiveness and innovation to create painting tools, which would later be used to paint a Communal Drawing of the River.

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


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
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to do in my collages is bring the Afro American experience into art and GIVE IT A UNIVERSAL DIMENSION.

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
