

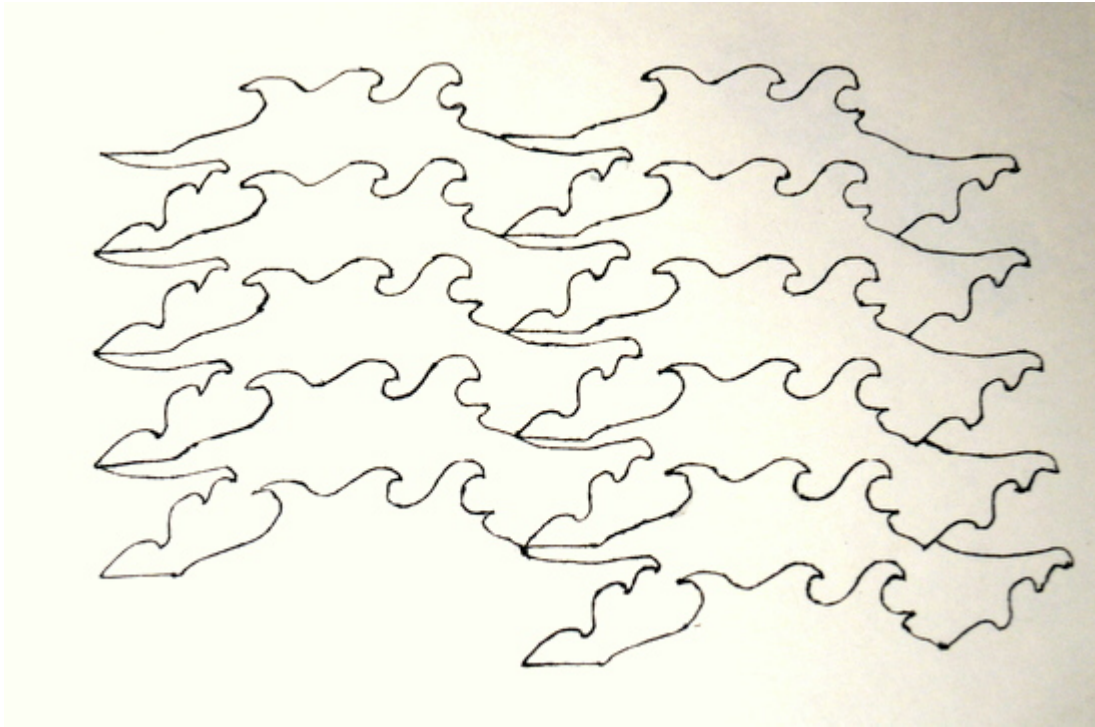
How to Make a Tessellated Design

Teenagers at AccessArt's Experimental Drawing Class demonstrate how to make a simple tessellated design using a cardboard stencil.



A tessellated pattern locks together, in both directions, when repeated.

In this post, teenagers show how they created their own stencils, using a simple method and then used them to create a repeated design.



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**drawing source material:
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Students, from the DesignLab at the V&A, London, worked with artist Phoebe Cummings over a three month period to create a site-specific, group piece, from unfired clay which was inspired by the historical 2D designs found on 19th century British tableware in the collection.

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
