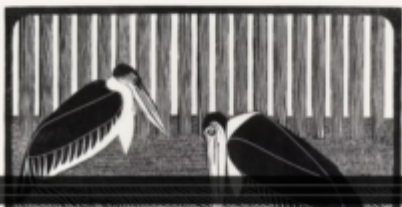
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Finding Marks Through Drawings Made by Artists

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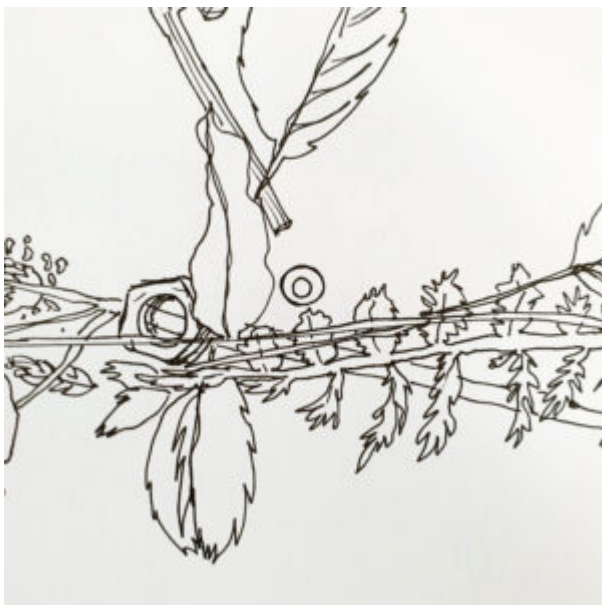

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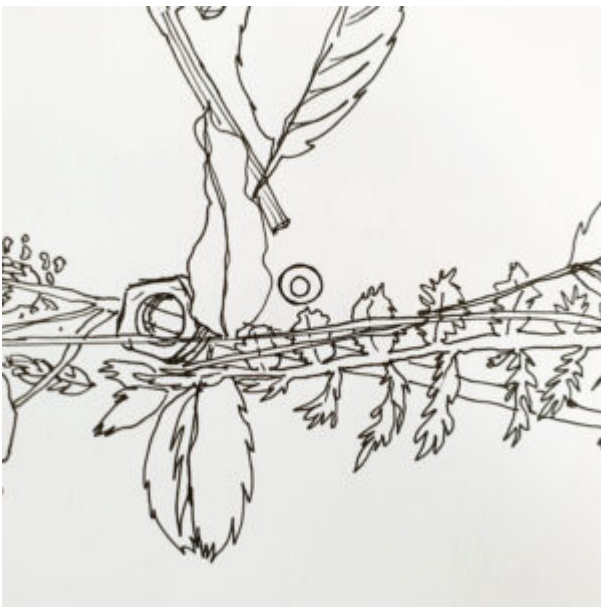

Using a well loved children's book as a starter for creating a beautiful and varied collage using different inking techniques.

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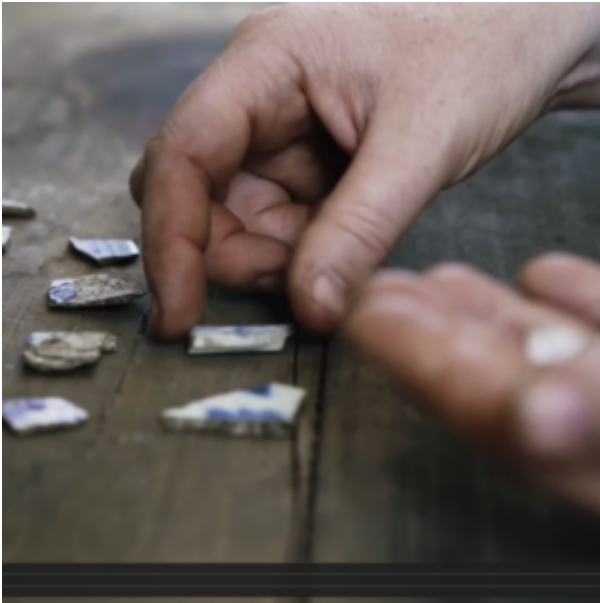
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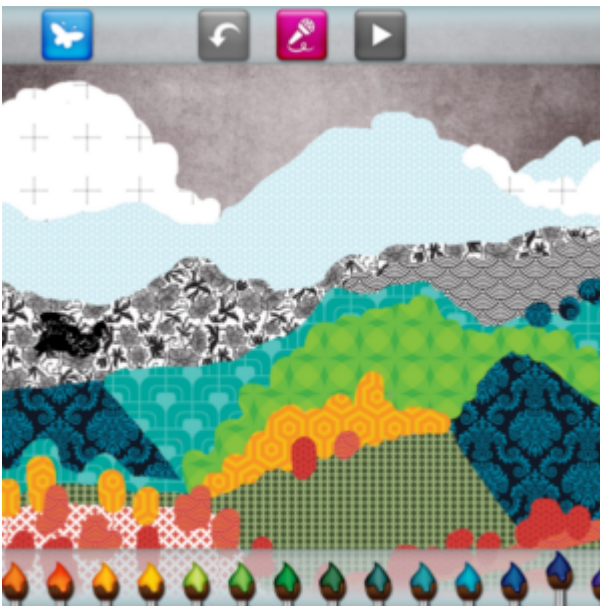
