The presentation was originally heard at the All Party Parliamentary Group for Art, Craft and Design Education in November 2020.

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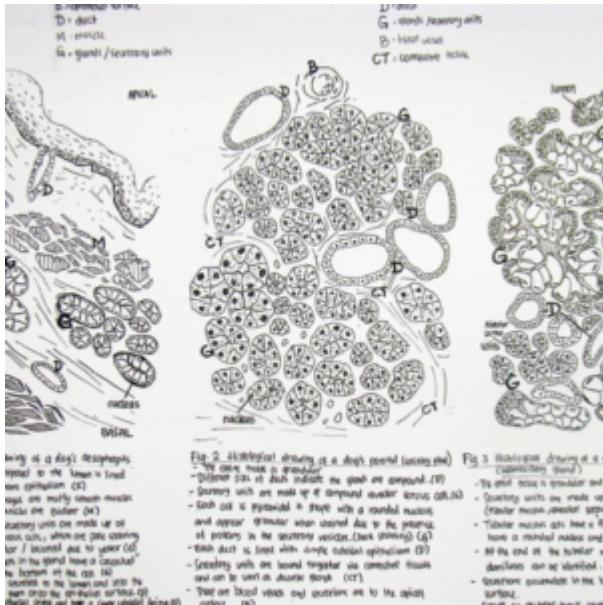
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
