
# A Cheerful Orchestra and Other Ideas for Drawing Music by Hannah Coulson

These musical activites are a delightful way to combine an exploration of drawing and music. The first, takes two contrasting elements to create a mythical instrument, explored through drawing and play. The second workshop shares ideas for large scale, collaborative drawings made in response to music. The final activity lets participants draw a self-portrait of themselves with an invented instrument, to create a colourful and original orchestra.


