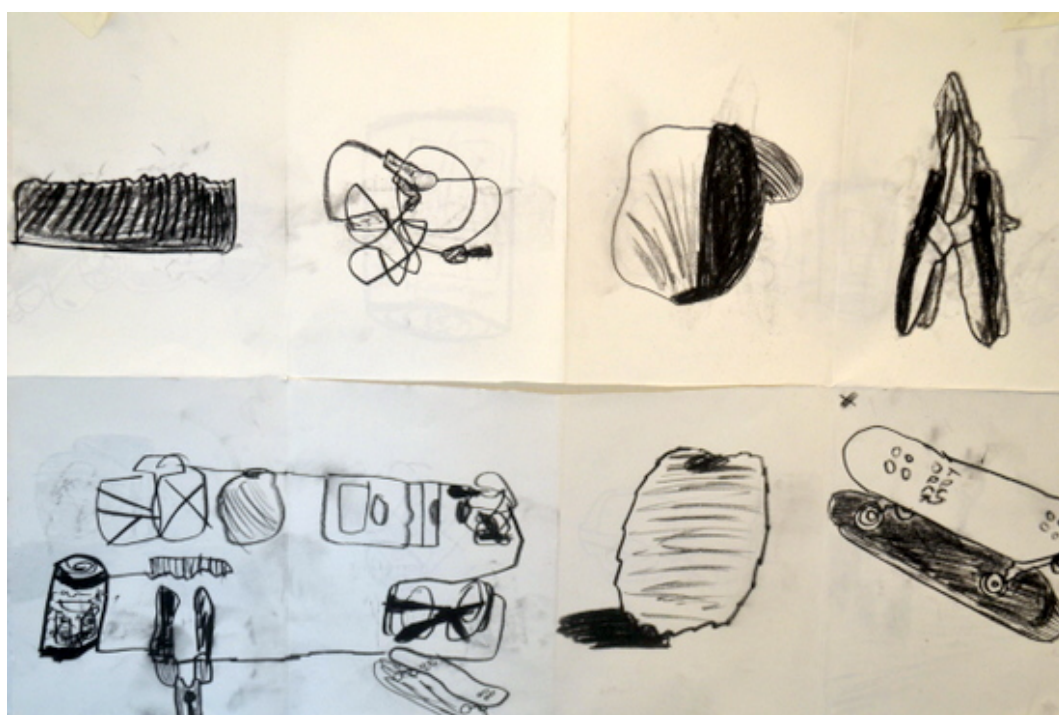


Using a Folded Sketchbook to Get Drawing!

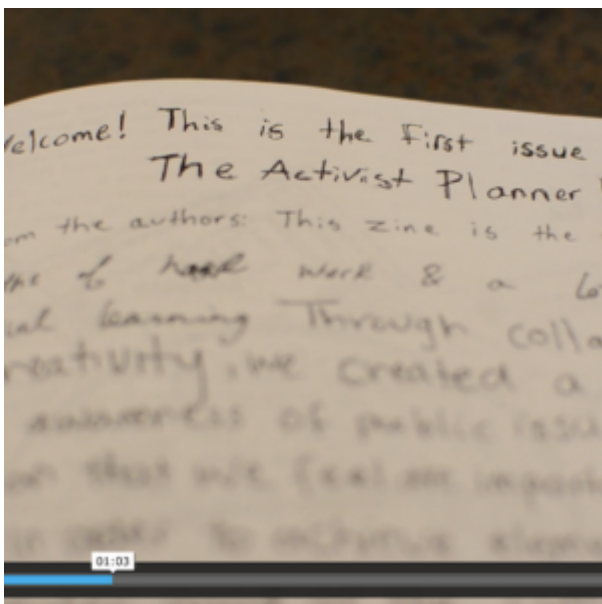
