This resource shares the Week Three session at <u>Jeavons Wood Primary School in Cambourne</u>, Cambridgeshire, in which I'll be working with a year 5 pupil (Lily-Rani) and a year 4 pupil (Daniel) for one hour once a week. - Provide the opportunity for the children to develop their hands-on making and visual arts skills through regular contact and small group work;

- Inspire visual arts projects amongst other pupils and staff in the school by sharing outcomes.
