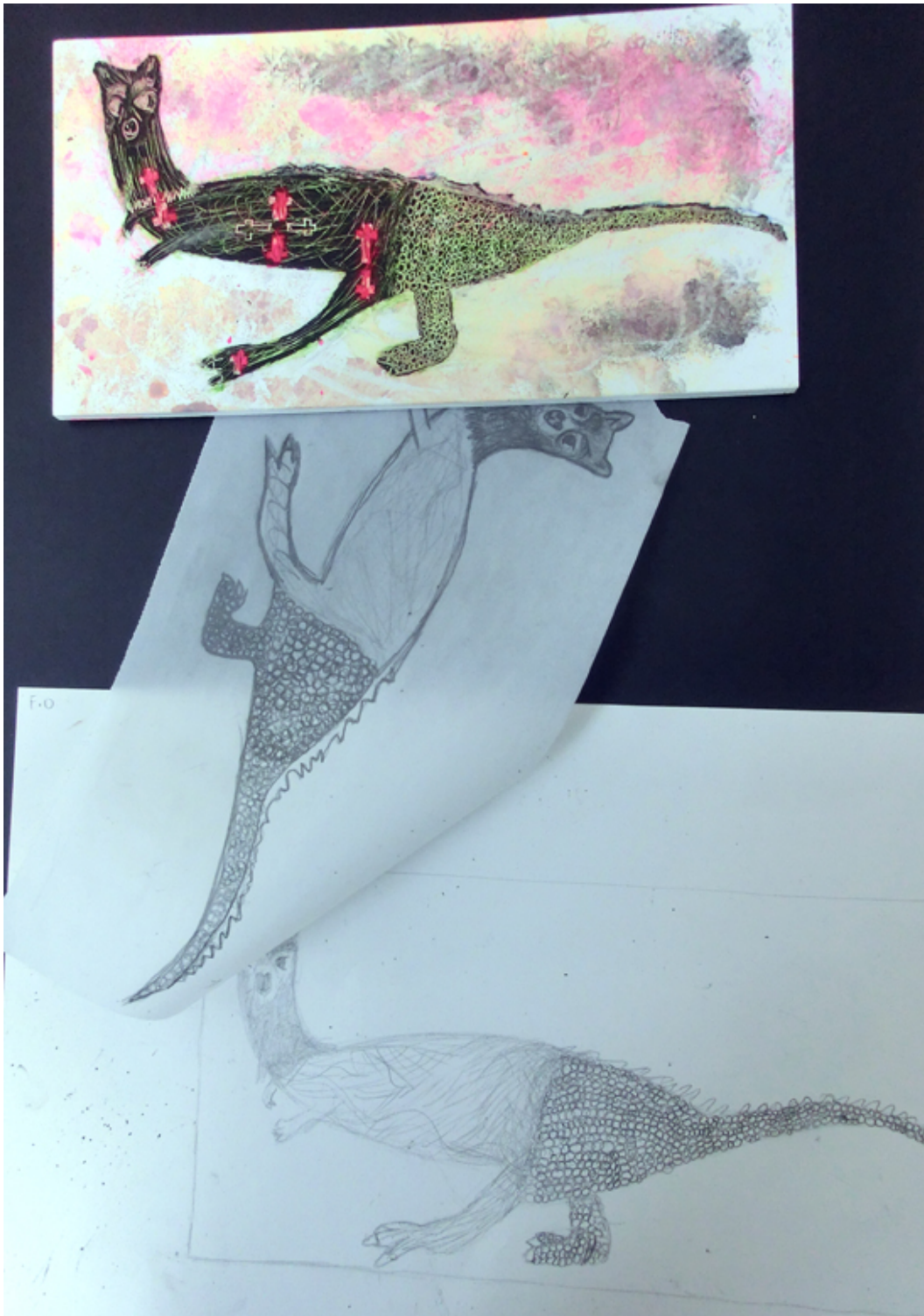


Wax Resist with Coloured Inks and Sgraffito on Foamboard
