Enjoy this collection of resources, all of which are easily adaptable for all ages and settings.

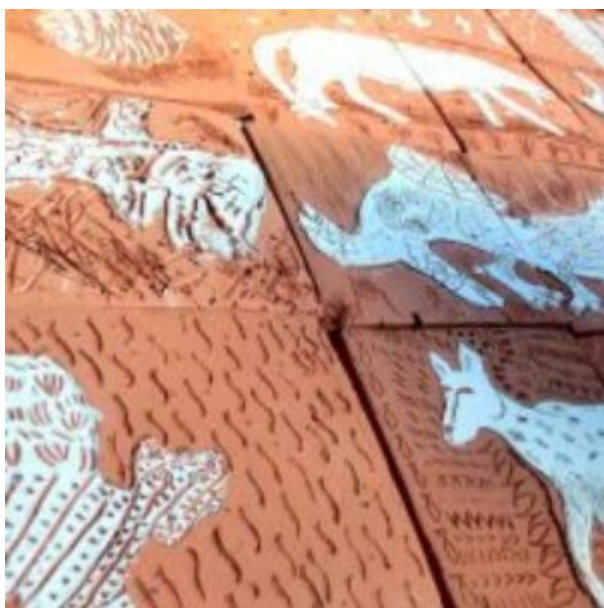
