Formative assessment should be a gentle tool. Its use is to ensure the teacher is providing the most appropriate level of facilitation, rather than to cast judgement upon a pupil...

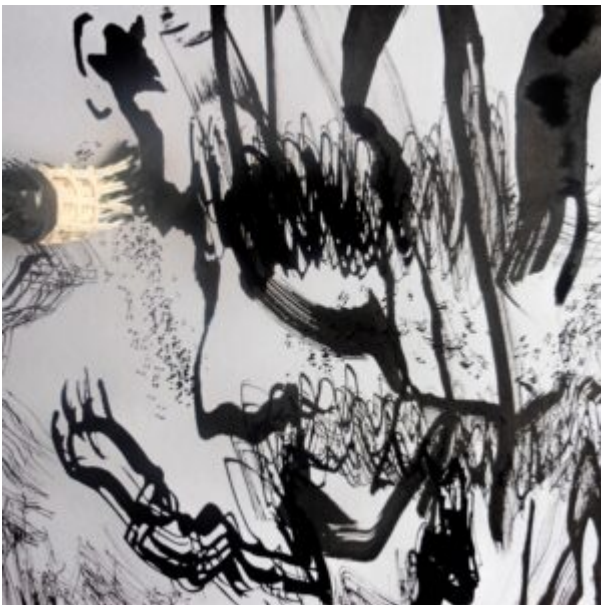

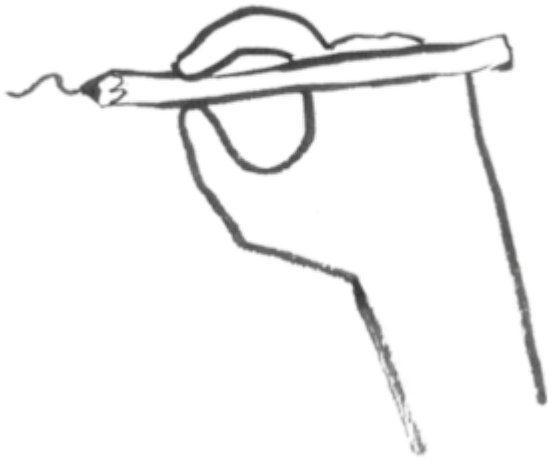
