By combining drawing with the art forms above, we provide learners with a tool which can help them reinterpret art made by other people, accessing and understanding their own emotions.

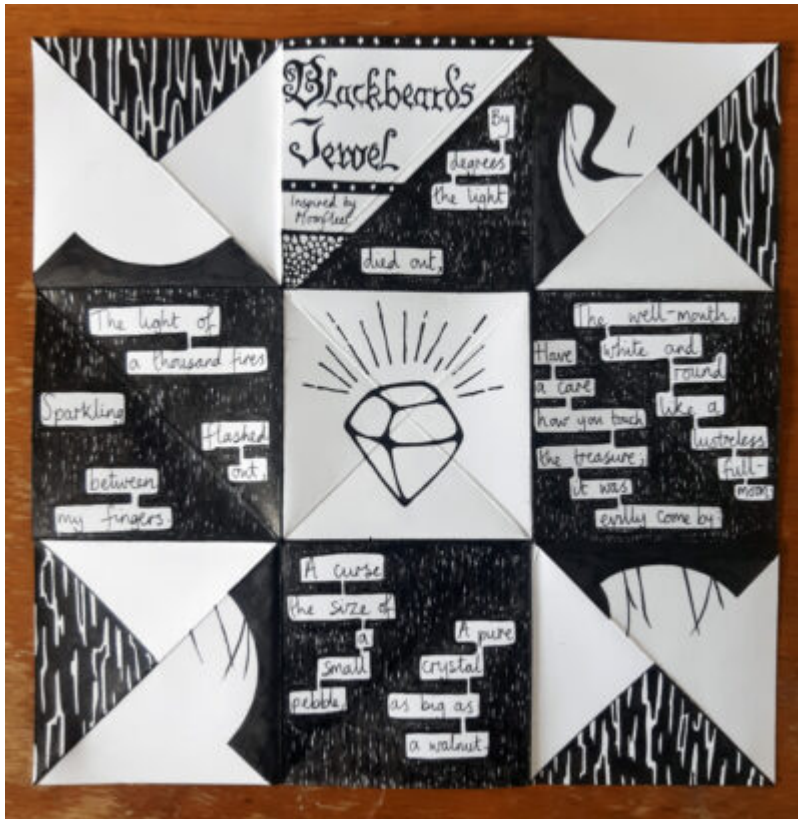
Educators can use these resources to connect art to other subject areas, including literacy, history, geography, science, drama and music.
