

Making Sea Sculptures at Culford School, Suffolk

Artists [Andrea Butler](#) and [Sheila Ceccarelli](#) inspire year three pupils to invent their own sculptural sea creatures using simple wrapping and binding techniques with scrap store materials.

[Culford School](#) invited us to facilitate a workshop for two classes of Year Three pupils, based on a sea theme. The school wanted the session to act as an ice-breaker to introduce the children to each other, and it took place in the school hall where all of the forty-five pupils could work together. We planned a drawing activity followed by a making session, to inspire the children to invent their own sculptural sea creatures using simple wrapping and binding techniques.
