
Red to Green: Making Sculpture

In this session, learners at Red2Green explored making sculpture.

Students had seen some sculptures on a visit to the 20th Century rooms at the <u>Fitzwilliam Museum</u>, <u>Cambridge</u>, but had little experience of making and limited exposure to Modern and Contemporary approaches.

Like in the previous session <u>Steps to Observational Drawing</u>, I thought it would be beneficial to try and break down processes to make incremental steps towards creating a finished piece. I wanted students to be pushed to explore how to make a free standing sculpture encompassing some modern, sculptural principles of form, shape and balance, yet with an accessible and tangible approach to working.
