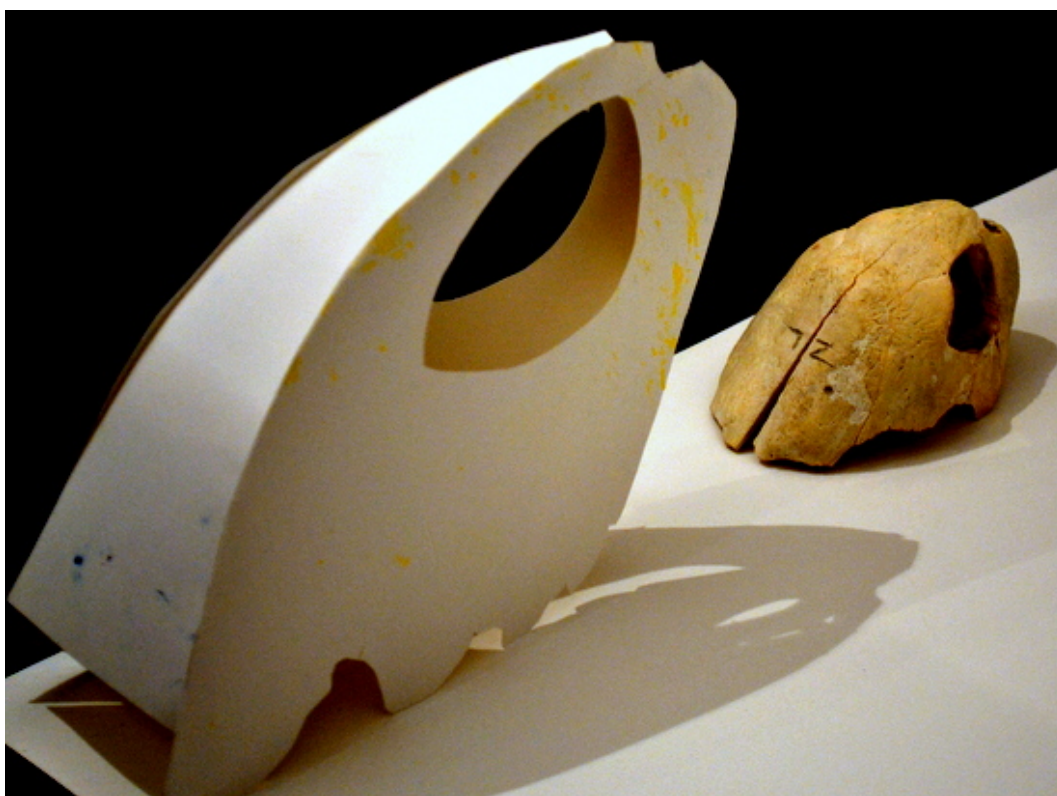


Skull Sculptures: using Paper and Tape to Interpret Form
