How do you think it would feel to watch one of these traditional puppet shows?

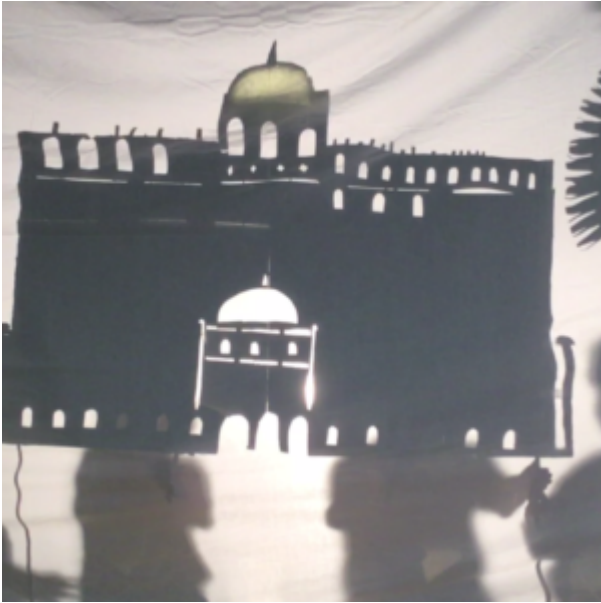
Describe the atmosphere?
