This exercise is about breaking down preconceived ideas about what drawing is and how we can use it to reinterpret the surrounding world.



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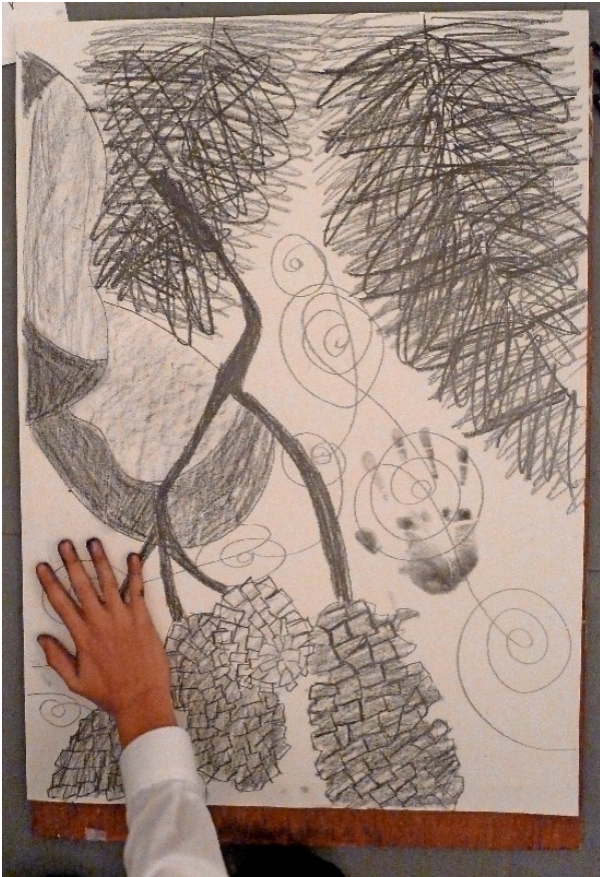
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“Feely Drawings” or Drawing by Touch – a 5 minute drawing exercise
