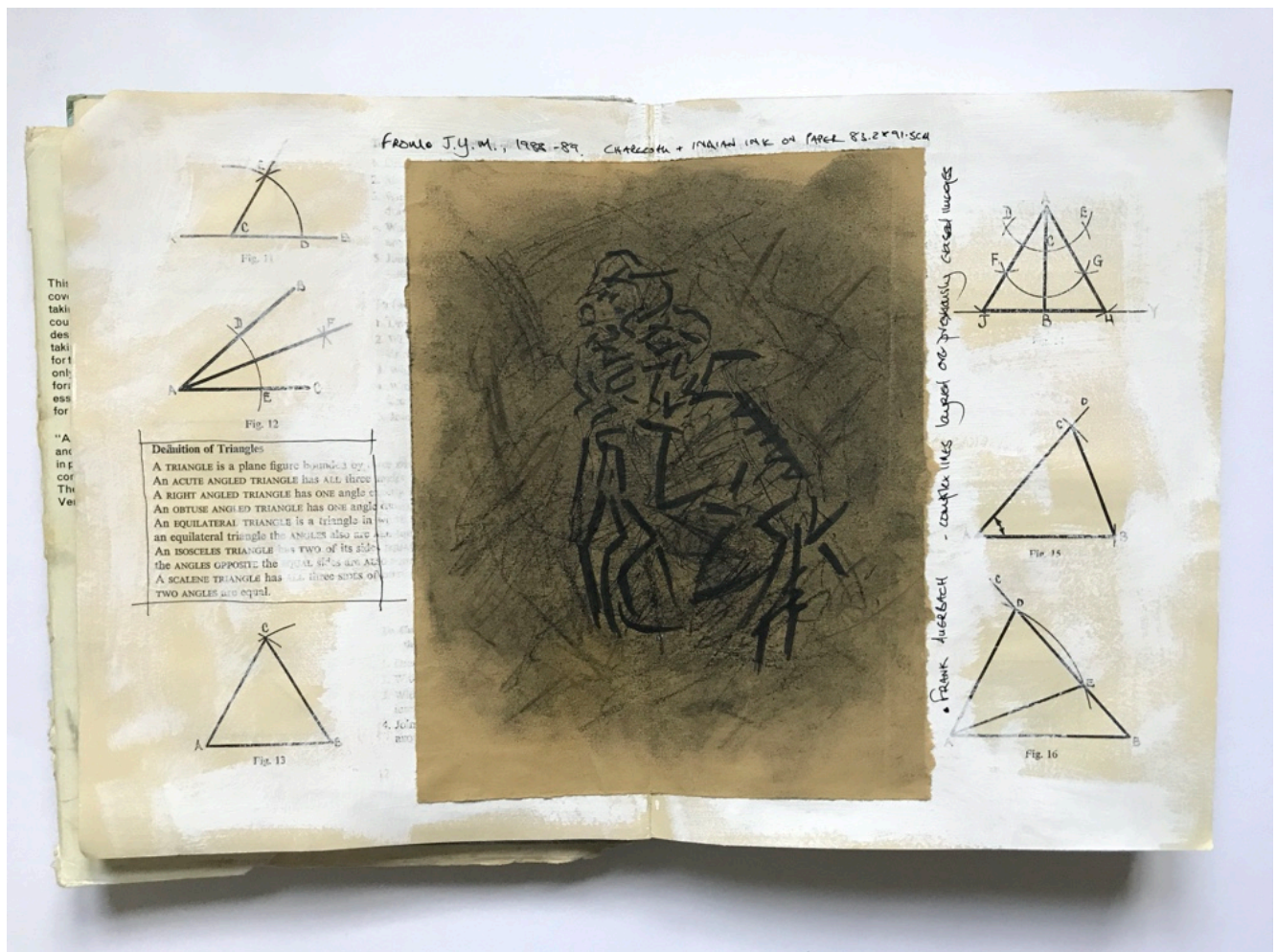


# Using a Found Book for a Sketchbook
