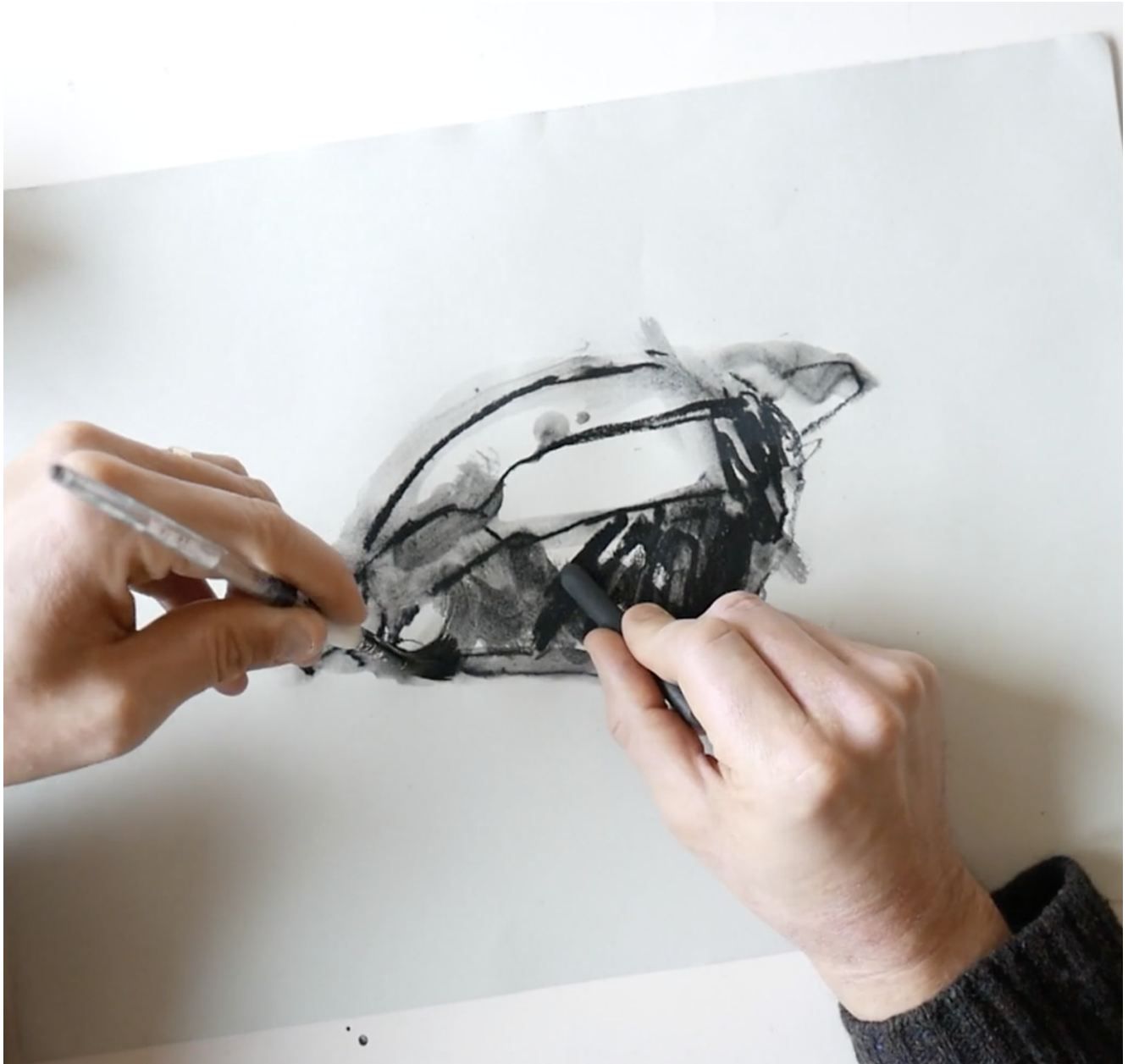
Aimed at: KS1/2 classroom teachers, art leads.
