Join us for the launch of an AccessArt Treehouse Challenge! We recognise that mainstream education doesn't work for every learner and that art can play a huge role in helping young people access education in a way that works for them. The AccessArt Treehouse Challenges aim to inspire learners, helping to find a creative way of working that enables and excites them.

In this practical In The Studio session, we will demonstrate a simple collage and typography challenge, aimed at encouraging learners to think creatively about shape, image and lettering. This challenge is aimed at learners aged 10 and upwards; however, with additional support could be used with younger learners.




